
Dear Attorney General Lynch:

I am writing with regard to my correspondence of the past two months to Mr. James C. Duff, Director of the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, concerning a matter of intense public interest that specifically addresses the potentially impeachable offenses committed by the Hon. Helen "Ginger" Berrigan, U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Louisiana.

Given the gravity of the allegations in my correspondence, I feel justified in expecting to receive a response from that agency. At a minimum, I would expect my inquiry to be acknowledged, and subsequently I would expect to receive an indication of what action, if any, it may take.

The public expects our Federal Judges to be held to the high standards to which they have sworn an oath to uphold, and to which they are obligated by law. And, as a citizen, I believe that I deserve no less than a response to my request to examine what I believe to be the failure of a Federal Judge to meet even the most basic requirements that her high office demands.
